## Myths about weather and climate.

Extreme weather is a regional event, not global.

Extreme weather is climate variation, not climate change.

Extreme weather is not created by CO2 in the atmosphere, but by energy from the sun.

Cutting human emissions of CO2 does not prevent extreme weather.

Over the past 45 years, the global average temperature increased linearly by 0.015 degrees per year. This means that there has not been a change in global temperature for the worse or better these years.

The atmosphere insulates, i.e. delays the departure of energy. The energy moves from hot to cold, never the other way around. It can happen in three different ways, radiation (long-wave), conduction (touch) or convection (exploitation). No energy is created in the atmosphere.
